Central Plains Center for Services

In partnership with the Nebraska Children and Families Foundation and the Nebraska Department of Health and Human Services, we administer our PALS Coaching, Education & Training Voucher (ETV), and Opportunity Passport (OPP) financial literacy programs across Nebraska. Our services are grounded in one-on-one relationships with youth, young adults, and their families and are focused on their strengths, goals, and future.

ETV funds can provide up to \$2,600 per year for tuition, books, and fees to eligible students for up to five years. The PALS program provides transition and independent living services, while our OPP program provides a match-savings, asset-building program. PALS and OPP are available to current and former foster youth, youth experiencing homelessness, pregnant and parenting youth, and youth experiencing or who are vulnerable to human trafficking.

Coordinating Commission for Postsecondary Education

The CCPE oversees programs like the Nebraska Opportunity Grant (NOG), FAFSA Completion Initiative, Access College Early (ACE) Scholarship, and the Community College Gap Assistance Program. The agency also assists in developing state financial aid strategies. In 2023-24, the Commission awarded Nebraska resident college students nearly \$27 million in need-based financial aid.
