

# College Access Grants Program

Helping Nebraska high schools increase their college-going rate

The EducationQuest *College Access Grants* program provides funding to Nebraska high schools that seek to increase their college-going rate. Grants are awarded every two years through a competitive application process. Eighty-nine Nebraska high schools have received grants since the program began in 2006.

## Funding Amounts

High schools are funded for four years with a goal to increase their college-going rate by 10 percentage points. Awards range from \$2,500 to \$20,000 per year based on the high school's 9th through 12th grade enrollment.

125 or less	\$2,500	Up to 8	100%
126 to 300	\$5,000	TBD*	20%
301 to 600	\$7,500	TBD*	15%
601 to 1,300	\$10,000	TBD*	10%
1,301 and up	\$20,000	Up to 4	10%

\*Number of awards will be determined based on the number of applications received in each category.

## Required Activities

High schools selected to receive a *College Access Grant* use the funding to coordinate college access activities including:

- visiting a college campus
- attending a College Fair or Educational Planning Program
- attending a Financial Aid Presentation
- completing the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)
- finding and applying for scholarships
- applying to at least one college
- providing information about dual enrollment courses
- encouraging family involvement
- developing business partnerships

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## College Access Grants to be awarded in 2020


EducationQuest will next award *College Access Grants* during the summer of 2020. High schools interested in applying must have a representative attend our *College Access Symposium* **April 16** in Lincoln, and must submit a Letter of Intent by **May 1**. Applications are due **July 1**. *Note: The Symposium was canceled. 
## Statewide representation of high schools that received *College Access Grants* in 2016 and 2018
