Nebraska High Schools Conducting Apply2College Events

(LINCOLN Neb. October 2, 2017) – Nearly 200 Nebraska high schools are helping seniors with the college application process during the statewide Apply2College Campaign October 2-31.

Through the campaign, high schools conduct events during the school day during which school staff and community volunteers help seniors complete college applications. EducationQuest Foundation sponsors the campaign and provides schools with free resources to help with their events.

“Completing a college application can be overwhelming for many students – especially those from families unfamiliar with the process,” said Les Monroe, EducationQuest director of college planning. “These events help reduce college application barriers for students and should increase the number of seniors who pursue higher education.”

Apply2College is part of the American College Application Campaign sponsored by the American Council on Education. All 50 states are now participating in the national effort.

Monroe said Nebraska high schools can still register to participate. Details are available in the Professionals section at EducationQuest.org.
